**HQ AETC FORCE PROTECTION
REQUIREMENTS COMMITTEE (FPRC)**

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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This instruction implements AFD 31-2, *Law Enforcement*, and AFDD 2-4.1, *Force Protection*. It establishes responsibilities and guidance for antiterrorism (AT) and force protection funding and programming procedures within AETC. This publication does not apply to Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve Command units. Maintain and dispose of records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication in accordance with AFMAN 37-139, *Records Disposition Schedule* (will become AFMAN 33-322, Volume 4). See **Attachment 1** for a glossary of references and supporting information used in this publication.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision changes the name of the group from HQ AETC Antiterrorism Working Group to HQ AETC Force Protection Requirements Committee (FPRC), updates mission statement (paragraph **1.**), changes representation of committee (paragraph **3.**), and deletes sample issue format. A bar (|) indicates revision from the previous edition.

1. Mission Statement. The HQ AETC Force Protection Requirements Committee (FPRC) is a cross-functional process action team chartered as the single focal point to provide oversight and support for all command AT funding and procurement efforts. This directive provides the AETC Commander a forum of staff representatives to evaluate and validate current AT requirements.

2. AT Defined. In AETC, AT is defined as the process of protecting people, equipment, and facilities through aggressive integration of AT awareness training and education, real-time intelligence, limited response and containment, and physical security measures, while emphasizing commander and individual responsibilities.

3. Membership and Organization. The FPRC operates under the sponsorship of HQ AETC/SF. Core members of the FPRC are representatives from all directorates and agencies within HQ AETC, to include the numbered air forces and Air University. Others can participate in meetings as needed.

4. Objectives. Objectives of the FPRC are to provide a:

- 4.1. Single focal point in AETC to furnish oversight and support for command AT funding and procurement efforts through the corporate process.
- 4.2. Forum to discuss assessment observations and the best solution to solve them.

5. Responsibilities. The FPRC will:

- 5.1. Meet on an as-required basis to examine AT funding issues and to review financial plans provided by AETC installations for submission into the program objective memorandum process.
- 5.2. Send its recommendations through the AETC corporate process for program review and approval.
