AFI 51-202, 7 November 2003, is supplemented as follows:

This supplement applies to all Air Force military personnel, including members of Air Force Reserve Command and Air National Guard while in federal service. It establishes AETC procedures for processing nonjudicial punishment actions for officers, chief master sergeants (CMSgt), and senior master sergeants (SMSgt) and delegates the powers of the AETC Commander to the AETC Vice Commander.

This instruction requires collection and maintenance of information protected by the Privacy Act of 1974 authorized by 10 U.S.C. § 815. Systems of Records notice F051AFJAF, Courts-Martial and Article 15 Records, applies. Maintain and dispose of records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication in accordance with AFMAN 37-139, *Records Disposition Schedule*.

2.7. The powers of the AETC Commander are delegated to the AETC Vice Commander.

2.10. All officer nonjudicial punishment actions will be imposed by the first general officer in the offender's chain of command. All nonjudicial punishment actions taken against CMSgts and SMSgts will be imposed by the promotion authority (AETC Commander and AETC Vice Commander).
